The arrangement on the main level included spray painted magnolia leaves, spray painted seeded eucalyptus, decorative green & white kale, silver brunia albiflora, dusty miller and branches of corkscrew hazel. Using Design Master brand metallic finish spray paint in the champagne gold color.





Gwen purposely designed something fun and different for the kid's room. The glass cylinder is filled mostly with clear Crystal Accents deco crystals. The glare from the windows makes it look like air bubbles, but there wasn't any. Suspended in the crystal mixture are purple Vanda orchids and printed/laminate golden tickets from the book/movie "The Polar Express". Vanda orchids have floppy petals, so when submerged in the crystals the petals show movement.
