## Foolproof Roses

Our annual combined meeting welcomed Angelina and Mike Chute. The couple have been growing roses for more than 25 years in their Providence garden. The program was centered around a slide presentation, expert narration and friendly tips on growing roses in our gardens.

Thank you to the Winchester Garden Club for arranging these informative speakers. The audience participation proves that, although we may dream of a rose garden, many of us need a boost of confidence like that offered by Angelina and Mike.

The Chute's "foolproof" method for successful roses include:

- Plant selection (choose "Foolproof" roses)
- Pruning
- Watering
- Fertilizing (2x/season)
- Sunlight (6 continuous hours)
- Organic soil

The 3D's of pruning which begins in the Spring:

- Prune off the *deadwood*
- Prune off the *damaged*/broken stalks
- Prune off the *diseased*

Your Spring To-Do List:

- Spring clean up
- Plant roses
- Prune roses
- Set up a feeding program
- Plant companion plants that attract beneficial insects
- Add mulch
- Enjoy

Shawabti Box 1295-1070B.C. - Egyptian Funerary Arts Gallery (Mummies)

Our inspiration is an ancient Egyptian piece of art called a Shawabti box.

These painted wooden boxes were used to hold Shawabti dolls, which are small funerary figures placed in the Shawabti boxes within the tombs of the deceased. Egyptians considered the afterlife a continuation of ones earthly existence so the Shawabti's purpose was to accompany the deceased and continue the work of the deceased in the afterlife. This piece was found at the Pyramids of Giza.

## WH&GC Fountain Restoration


